(Mahrika) Focus of Idaho Drug Free Youth (IDFY), want to have every teen have the power to live happy and healthy lives. Celebrated 35 years of the organization. IDFY Vison: a statewide community of youth and adults who promote a drug-free way of life for all students by encouraging positive peer and adult influence and providing drug-free activities, education, and support. Our goal is to reach every teen in Idaho, offering various levels of involvement to meet you where you are. Whether you're looking to join a chapter, participate in campaigns, or take on leadership roles, there's a place for you at IDFY. Chapter program, created to be specific enough for everyone to have a guideline to follow but also vague enough to be flexible when needed. Difficult time getting into the school this year. Youth vision: online social media houses our campaigns. Campaigns are a call to action, something youth can physically do. 5 different campaigns: photography contest, pass the positivity, 21 matters pledge (focuses on brain science), stand out campaign, and 1,000 good things. Youth Vision Ambassadors – 8 of them throughout the state. 121 presentation in the schools. 3–6-hour program for 150-200 kids. Great opportunity to get everyone into the same room. Asks questions that build and escalate, by the end of presentation you're raising your hand if "alcohol has impacted you?" Leadership retreat, taking place in November in Challis this year.
